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Carbon Disclosure Project

CBS has always strived to operate in an environmentally sound and responsible manner. Using our resources efficiently and reducing waste minimizes our carbon footprint; has a positive impact on the communities in which we operate; and offers economic benefits and opportunities for long-term annual savings.

To that end, CBS participates with the Carbon Disclosure Project (CDP) by providing information on greenhouse gas emissions on an annual basis. The CDP gathers emissions data from approximately 3,000 of the world's largest companies in more than 60 countries. This data can:

- Provide increased transparency to shareholders, clients, and the public
- Identify how the organization intends to address whatever threats arise from climate change
- Help focus on available business opportunities
- Enhance the ability to increase efficiency and reduce unnecessary costs

By responding to the CDP questionnaire each year, corporations identify their greenhouse gas emissions and identify ways to lower their energy consumption and use more renewable sources. Sharing emissions data and reduction goals through the CDP questionnaire can build trust among stakeholders; confidence among investors; and provide assistance to companies to understand where they fall in relation to others in their industry.

The information the CDP collects and distributes is used in the following ways:

- By financial decision makers in their investment, lending, and insurance analysis.
- By national and local governments to ascertain the impact of climate change in their supply chain.
- By providing water-related data from the world's largest corporations to inform the global market place on investment risk and commercial opportunity.
- By helping global corporations to understand the impacts of climate change across the supply chain and harnessing their collective purchasing power to encourage suppliers to measure and disclose climate change information.

Using the information provided by the participating corporations, the CDP works to transform the way in which the world does business and address the potential impacts of climate change.
